MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome to *Saxon Country*! The 2010-2011 school year at Langley High School is about to begin and we have adopted several new themes and practices to inspire school spirit and personal responsibility. As you drive onto campus, you will see banners that say "This is Saxon Country." It's not just a slogan. It's an attitude and a philosophy that we plan to promote throughout the school year and beyond. Our aim is to celebrate the phenomenal achievements of our students and build on our unique Langley pride.

Our students are indeed proud and spirited. They show this spirit differently from other schools. However, in my two years as their principal, I have seen few schools with a deeper sense of pride. We want to build on this existing attitude and bring it out into the open. And, at the same time, send a strong message that taking personal responsibility for our actions and behaviors brings respect and honor to our school.

This message was crafted by the PTSA and administrators working in collaboration. It already has the support of the coaches and when the school year begins, I'm sure it will have the strong backing of the faculty as well. Here is the message: You are in Saxon Country whenever and wherever you gather with fellow Saxons. In Saxon Country, you take pride in yourself; take responsibility for your successes and failures; take care of each other; understand that everything you do reflects on the Langley community; and you participate in our school community. We are open to adapting the nuances or script of the message, but the essential idea should remain the same – take personal responsibility to support and honor Langley High School.

As we look ahead to a new sense of spirit, we do not want to forget what has made Langley great for decades. The students' academic achievements have once again risen to our high expectations. A long year of very hard work has paid off with great SOL results, superior Advanced Placement scores, and a high number of upper tier university acceptances. Over half of our students received "pass advanced" on SOL tests. Several subjects broke school records with AP score averages above 4 (5 is the top score). And, we sent record numbers of students to UVA, Virginia Tech and JMU, as well as a dozen to the Ivy League. We are very proud of our success and you should be extremely proud of your kids for their hard work and determination.

We still have work to do. Our students' high achievements happen because we, as a community, continue to reassess and reevaluate what we do and how we do it. We have made a few adjustments

to Saxon Time to ensure that students who need the teacher's attention the most get it. We are making a huge push to decrease the number of tardy arrivals, especially to morning classes, which have detracted from valuable instruction time. We need your help with this! Please review the new tardy policy (on the school website under the tab Student) and make every effort to encourage your student to get to school on time.

We have inaugurated The Langley Read with *Outliers*, by Malcolm Gladwell. Did you finish it yet? Finally, we continue to advance our Professional Learning Community model so that all students have the support of an entire team of teachers as they learn, are assessed, and review the material until it is mastered.

I want to thank the PTSA and the entire parent community for their support these last two years. Beginning my third year as your principal is more exciting than the first two because I have met so many wonderful people and families. It is truly a pleasure and I enjoy being here. Thanks to everyone for your continued support.

Testing

PSAT AND ACT EXPLORE: WED, OCT 13

All 9th, 10th and 11th grade students should report to school at 7:20 am on Wed, Oct 13, for the administration of the ACT Explore or PSAT test and should bring #2 pencils (not mechanical) and a calculator. Though all students are strongly encouraged to take the grade-level college admission practice test, students may opt out and will be assigned to a study hall in the Library. All students will be released by 12:10 pm. Afternoon buses will run after dismissal.

Ninth grade students will take the ACT Explore test, a practice opportunity for the ACT and one specifically normed for 9th graders. Langley is a test site for the ACT and increasing numbers of college-bound students are taking the ACT in addition to or instead of the SAT. All 9th graders are encouraged to take the ACT Explore for practice, however only those students who pay for the test will receive a score report. Cost for the test is \$17. Checks should be made payable to Langley High School and returned to the Main Office with the completed payment form (found in the back-to-school packet or on the Langley website, PTSA, Class of 2014).

Tenth grade students will take the PSAT, a practice opportunity for the SAT. No enrollment form or payment is necessary as FCPS pays to score the results for all sophomores.

Eleventh grade students will take the PSAT, not only as a practice opportunity for the SAT, but test scores are used to determine the awarding of National Merit Scholarships. All 11th graders are encouraged to take the PSAT, however only those students who pay for the test will receive a score report. The cost is \$17. Checks should be made payable to Langley High School and returned to the Main Office with the completed payment form (found in the back-to-school packet or on the Langley website, PTSA, Class of 2012).

SOL FALL TESTING

During the test window of Mon, Sept 20 through Fri, Sept 24, the following groups of students will have the opportunity to take an SOL test linked to an SOL course they have completed for credit:

1. Transfer students
2. Students who completed SOL coursework during the summer
3. Students absent during the May 2010 SOL test window
4. Students who have previously failed SOL tests

Students in each of those categories will be contacted as to which SOL tests they are eligible to take, be provided with remediation material and given a time and place for the test.

Important Reminder: Before making spring travel plans, check the LHS website for the 2010-2011 testing calendar. College Board AP tests will be administered Mon, May 2 through Fri, May 13. The English 11 Writing SOL is scheduled for Tue, Mar 8 through Fri, Mar 11, and the End-of-Course SOL test window will be May 23 - June 10.

TEEN TRAFFIC SAFETY PROGRAM – NEW FOR DRIVER EDUCATION

A new law concerning driver's education goes into effect in September 2010. As part of the classroom driver education instruction, students and their parent/guardian are required to attend a 90-minute traffic safety program. This requirement must be met before the student can receive a Driver Education Certificate of Completion (commonly referred to as the "green card"). **THIS IS MANDATORY.**

The first opportunity to attend this program will be Mon, Sept 13, 7 pm in the auditorium. The doors will close at 7 and no one will be admitted once the doors have closed. Be prepared to stay for the entire 90 minutes. If you leave early, your presence will not be counted and you will need to repeat the session. There will be three more sessions throughout the school year, occurring the first week of each quarter. You are encouraged to attend the session during the quarter your student is enrolled in driver's education.

Please be aware of the following procedures that have been established to fulfill the requirements of the new law:

- Student must attend with their parent/guardian
- Parent/guardian is required to show a valid driver's license or state issued identification card
- Attendance for the FULL 90 minutes is required
- Proper completion of the registration form is required (the form is distributed at the session)
- Program must be completed during the year student is enrolled in grade 10 health and PE
- No fees are charged to FCPS students. Fees are only assessed if taken through Adult and Continuing Education.
